RETIREMENT SYSTEM - BASIS FOR CONTRIBUTION For miscellaneous personnel the basis for contribution shall be full compensation. (Ord. 540 ss4, 1970: Ord. 102 ss6, 1961). SOCIAL SECURITY - ELECTION TO PARTICIPATE The City shall become a participant in the social security system and the benefits of old age and survivors' insurance shall be extended to its employees and officers. (Ord. 34 ss1, 1959). *For provisions on deferred compensation, see ss2.48.210. SOCIAL SECURITY - AUTHORITY TO EXECUTE PLAN The Mayor and the City Clerk are authorized to execute and deliver to the Washington Department of Employment-Security for its approval the plan or plans required under the provisions of Section 5 of said enabling act and of the Social Security Act to extend coverage to the employees and officers of this municipality and to do all other-things necessary to that end: (Ord. 34 ss2, 1959). SOCIAL SECURITY - PAYROLL DEDUCTIONS The officer, as may be designated by the Mayor, is authorized to make all required payments into the contribution fund established by the said enabling act and to establish such system of payroll deductions from the salaries of employees and officers as may be necessary to their coverage under-said old age and survivors' insurance system. (Ord. 34 ss3, 1959). SOCIAL SECURITY - CONTINUED IMPLEMENTATION Such officials of the municipality shall do all things necessary to the continued implementation of said-system. (Ord. 34 ss4, 1959). UNIFORMED EMPLOYEES' DISABILITY RETIREMENT Uniformed employees covered under the L.E.O.F.F. Retirement-System, Plan I, shall apply for disability retirement under the provisions of RCW 41.26.120. Disability pay benefits shall also be excluded as taxable wages under Federal Old Age and Survivor's Insurance (O.A.S.I.) (Ord. 1155 ss2, 1980). Section 3. Severability. If any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance should be held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the validity or constitutionality of any other section, sentence, clause or 42 phrase or word of this ordinance. 43 44 Section 4. Effective Date. This ordinance, being an exercise of a power specifically delegated to

the City legislative body, is not subject to referendum, and shall take effect five (5) days after passage and

publication of an approved summary thereof consisting of the title.
