G PORTIONS OF THE LYNNWOOD CITY CODE AND AMENDING

AN ORDINANCE REPEALING PORTIONS OF THE LYNNWOOD CITY CODE AND AMENDING THE SAID CODE WITH RELATION TO AMBULANCE DRIVERS, ATTENDANTS AND EQUIPMENT.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LYNNWOOD DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION I: That the portions of title 5.44.070 which read as follows:

b. Is of the age of twenty-one years or over and morally fit for the position. The applicant must submit to fingerprinting by the police department and shall submit with the application for license a full face photograph in triplicate, one to be part of applicant's license if issued, one for police department files, and the other shall be filed with application for license.

f. Has an advanced first aid card, as issued by the Washington state department of labor and industries.

should be and the same are hereby repealed, and the Lynnwood City Code, Title 5.44.070 is hereby revised and amended to reas as follows, to-wit:

b. Is of the age of twenty-one years or over if applying for driver's permit or is of the age of eighteen years or over if applying for attendant's permit; and is morally fit for the position. The applicant must submit to fingerprinting by the police department and shall submit with the application for license a full face photograph in triplicate, one to be part of applicant's license if issued, one for police department files, and the other shall be filed with application for license.

f. Has an advanced first aid card as issued by the American Red Cross or the Washington State Department of Labor and Industries.

SECTION II: That the portions of Title 5.44.100 which reads as follows, to-wit:

1. Resuscitator and twenty-five feet of hose.(1)

8. (1) Adult size splint.

17. An attendant's bag which shall contain the following:

(1) Bandage shears

(2) Flashlights (one regular & one pencil type)

 Large airway

(6) Rolls three-inch bandages

(2) Rolls one-inch adhesive tape

(4) Arm Splints

(6) Tongue depressors

(1) Infants oxygen face cone

(2) Cravats

(3) Eighteen-inch pieces surgical rubber tubing

(10) Four by four inch gauze pack

(2) Rolls one and one-half inch or two-inch tape

(4) Packages universal antidote

Transportation of patients. Each ambulance, while transporting a patient, shall be manned by two qualified and uniformed attendants, one a driver and the other an attendant, both of whom shall be twenty-one years old or over and shall have been approved per section 5.44.070 and 5.44.080, and proof of his qualifications shall be carried with him at all times. It shall be the duty of the driver of an ambulance in an emergency case to discharge any injured or deceased patient at the hospital nearest the place where the patient is picked up unless otherwise directed by the injured person or the relatives.

should be and the same is hereby repealed, and the Lynnwood City Code Title 5.44.120 is hereby revised and amended to read as follows, to-wit:

Transportation of patients. Each ambulance, while transporting a pateint, shall be manned by two qualified and uniformed attendants, one a driver who shall be of the age of twenty-one years or over, and the other an attendant who shall be of the age of eighteen years or over and shall each have been approved per sections 5.44.070 and 5.44.080, and proof of his qualifications shall be carried with him at all times. It shall be the duty of the driver of an ambulance in an emergency case to discharge any injured or deceased patient at the hospital nearest the place where the patient is picked up unless otherwise directed by the injured person or the relatives.

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after five (5) days after its passage and publication according to law.
