12 13 14 15 16	WHEREAS, under Chapters 35A.11 and 35A.63 RCW, the City Council of the City of Lynnwood has the authority to adopt ordinances relating to the use of real property located within the City; and
17 17 18 19	WHEREAS, Chapter 21.18 LMC establishes parking requirements for development in Lynnwood; and
20 21 22	WHEREAS, the Edmonds School District is planning to rebuild or significantly renovate many of its facilities, including facilities in Lynnwood, in the near future; and
23 24 25 26 27	WHEREAS, the Edmonds School District believes that LMC requirements for parking at elementary and middle schools are excessive and inconsistent with surrounding jurisdictions, that compliance would add significant costs that would be borne by the public, and has asked the City to consider amending the requirements; and
28 29 30	WHEREAS, the City has found that a decrease in parking requirements for elementary and middle schools is reasonable based upon a review of the data;
81 82 83	WHEREAS, the City Council finds the provisions in this Ordinance are in the best interest of the health, safety and welfare of the community; and
4 5 6 7	WHEREAS, on the 30 <sup>th</sup> day of September, 2015, notice of the proposed code amendment was sent to the Washington State Department of Commerce in accordance with RCW 36.70A.106; and
8 19	WHEREAS, on the 1 <sup>st</sup> day of October, 2015, the City of Lynnwood SEPA Responsible Official issued a Determination of Non-Significance (DNS) on the proposal; and

41 **WHEREAS**, on the 22<sup>nd</sup> day of October, 2015, the Lynnwood Planning Commission 42 held a public hearing on proposed amendments to the Lynnwood Municipal Code in this 43 Ordinance, and all persons wishing to be heard were heard; and

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# WHEREAS, on the 10<sup>th</sup> day of December, 2015, the Lynnwood Planning Commission held a continuance of a public hearing on proposed amendments to the Lynnwood Municipal Code in this Ordinance, and all persons wishing to be heard were heard; and

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53 NOW THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LYNNWOOD, WASHINGTON,
54 DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

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56 <u>Section 1. Findings</u>. Upon consideration of the provisions of this Ordinance in light of the 57 decision criteria specified by LMC 21.20.500, the City Council finds that the amendments 58 contained herein are: a) consistent with the comprehensive plan; and b) substantially 59 related to the public health, safety, or welfare; and c) not contrary to the best interest of 50 the citizens and property owners of the city of Lynnwood.

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62 Section 2. Amendment. LMC 21.02.645 is hereby amended as follows:

63 21.02.645 Schools, elementary, middle and high.

64 "School" means, unless further qualified, elementary, middle and high. The terms 65 "elementary schools", "middle schools" and"high schools" mean institutions of learning 66 offering instruction in the several branches of learning and study required by the education 67 code of the state of Washington to be taught in the public and parochial (or private) 68 schools.

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Section 3. Amendment. Table 21.18.03 of LMC 21.18.800, relating to off-street parking
capacity requirements, is hereby amended as follows:

If any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance should 74 be held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity 75 or unconstitutionality shall not affect the validity or constitutionality of any other section, 76 sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance. 

58 Section 5. Effective Date. This Ordinance or a summary thereof consisting of the title shall
be published in the official newspaper of the City, and shall take effect and be in full force
five (5) days after publication.
