1 CITY OF LYNNWOOD 2 3 **ORDINANCE NO. 3410** 4 5 AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF LYNNWOOD, WASHINGTON, RELATING 6 TO THE CITY'S BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS; AMENDING CHAPTERS 7 2.24, 2.26, 2.29, 2.60, 2.30 AND 2.28 OF THE LYNNWOOD MUNICIPAL 8 CODE; AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, AN EFFECTIVE DATE AND 9 SUMMARY PUBLICATION. 10 11 12 WHEREAS, pursuant to state law, the City is authorized, and in some cases required, to establish 13 certain advisory boards and commissions to accomplish the City's purposes; and 14 15 WHEREAS, in Chapter 2.24 of the Lynnwood Municipal Code, the City Council has established 16 regulations and provisions of general applicability to all of the City's advisory boards and commissions; 17 and 18 19 WHEREAS, in Chapters 2.26, 2.29, 2.60, 2.30, and 2.28 of the Lynnwood Municipal Code, the City 20 Council has established provisions relating to some of the City boards and commissions, including the Arts 21 Commission (Chapter 2.26), Planning Commission (Chapter 2.29), Diversity, Equity and Inclusion 22 Commission (Chapter 2.60), the History and Heritage Board (Chapter 2.30), and the Parks and Recreation 23 Board (Chapter 2.28). 24 25 WHEREAS, the City has determined that it is necessary to revise the City code provisions relating 26 to the boards and commissions listed above, to meet requirements of state law and to promote the 27 efficient and effective operation of the boards and commissions; and 28 29 WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that it is appropriate, and in the best interests of the 30 public health, safety, and general welfare, to amend the Lynnwood Municipal Code as stated in this 31 Ordinance; now, therefore 32 33 THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LYNNWOOD, WASHINGTON, DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS: 34 Chapter 2.24, entitled "Advisory Bodies – General Provisions," of the Lynnwood Municipal 35 Section 1. 36 Code is amended to read as follows:

- 1 A. Each advisory body shall be guided by a specific statement of purpose and function, which will be
- 2 reviewed at least every four years by the city council to determine its effectiveness. This statement of
- 3 purpose, as well as other information regarding duties and responsibilities, will be made available to all
- 4 members when appointed.

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- 5 B. The city council may determine any specific guidelines or tasks to be referred to an advisory body by
- 6 motion, resolution or ordinance.
- 7 C. Each advisory body shall develop a scope of work, within the body's jurisdiction and area of
- 8 responsibility that may, as the city council determines necessary and appropriate, include the following:
- 9 1. Review relevant portion(s) of city plans and regulations and suggest desired amendments thereto.
 - Review relevant portion(s) of the city budget and suggest desired amendments, as relates to Lynnwood's community vision, strategic plan, comprehensive plan, capital facilities plan, and policy matters.
 - Participate in the preparation of the advisory body annual report showing achievement towards fulfilling goals, policies, and objectives of the advisory body.
 - 4. Present major policy advisories to the city council.
- 17 5. Meet with city council and other boards.
- 6. Examine and respond to referrals from the city council, mayor, or staff, including public
 meetings or formal hearings. (Ord. 3248 § 1, 2017; Ord. 3150 § 1, 2015; Ord. 2121 § 1, 1997)
- 20 2.24.030 Membership, nomination and confirmation process, reappointment process, residency and
- voter registration requirements, and responsibilities.
- 22 The number of members and any specific qualifications of each advisory body shall be set forth by
- ordinance. The position number for each member shall be set forth by ordinance, resolution, or motion.
- 24 Except as specifically provided by applicable law, the following procedures and requirements shall apply
- 25 to the appointment of all members of each advisory body:
- A. Except where non-resident members are authorized for certain bodies, a member shall be a resident
- of the city for the full duration of their term.

- 1 B. Advisory body members shall be registered voters. Voter registration requirements for up to one
- 2 member of each board or commission may be waived by the mayor and confirmed by Council if the
- 3 individual is ineligible to be a registered voter.
- 4 C. Each person wishing to serve on a city advisory board shall submit an application to the city.
- 5 D. Twice a year, the administration shall provide to the council a report on all applications to serve on
- 6 city advisory bodies received in the time period since the date of the most recent report. The report
- 7 shall contain at a minimum the name of all applicants, the date of receipt of their application by the
- 8 city, the advisory body to which they applied, and the date and disposition of each application.
- 9 E. Each person to be appointed shall be nominated by the mayor for to a specific advisory body,
- 10 position number, and term.
- 11 F. Each confirmation motion by the council shall include the position number, ending date and term
- for the position to which the person is appointed, and service shall begin after confirmation by the
- city council or on a date determined by motion of the council.
- 14 G. Ninety days prior to term expiration, the advisory body member shall provide written notification to
- the mayor's office regarding the individual's desire to serve a subsequent full term. There is not a
- vested right to renomination or reappointment to any position. When considering renomination or
- 17 reappointment, the mayor and city council may consider factors such as the individual's attendance,
- participation, and effectiveness during the term.
- 19 H. All newly appointed advisory body members must complete a Board and Commission Member
- Training module prior to their first official meeting as an advisory body member and must sign and
- return a Training Acknowledgement Form. This training must be taken every four years. As an
- appointed city officer, each advisory body member shall perform the member's duties in a manner
- 23 <u>consistent with applicable law, including the city of Lynnwood's code of ethics as set forth in</u>
- 24 Chapter 2.94 LMC, and applicable provisions of the Open Public Meetings Act as set forth in Chapter
- 42.30 RCW and the Public Records Act as set forth in Chapter 42.56 RCW.
- 26 I. Any person may be removed from an advisory body by the mayor, with approval of the city council

- 29 **2.24.040 Officers Identification and election.**

- 32 necessary and such offices shall be set forth in the rules of procedure adopted by the advisory body.

- by motion approved by the advisory body, which may include a statement of the reasons, facts,
- 7 policies, and/or findings of the body supporting the motion or resolution, and which shall be

17 2.24.080 Conflicts of interest.

- 18 If an advisory body member concludes that <u>the member</u> has a conflict of interest or an appearance of
- 19 fairness issue with respect to a matter pending before the advisory body, the advisory body member
- 20 shall recuse themselves from participating in all deliberations and decision-making related to the

22 **2.24.090** Liaisons and administrative support.

- advisory body's chair, noticing meetings, preparation and dissemination of meeting minutes,
- 31 posting minutes to the city website, providing training opportunities, and generally advising on city

- 15 Members of an advisory body shall serve without compensation. Members may be reimbursed for

- **2.24.130 Lobbying efforts.**
- 19 Lobby efforts by any advisory body on legislative, or political, matters should first be checked for
- 20 consistency with applicable law and existing city policy by contacting the mayor's office. In the event a
- 21 position is taken that differs from that of the city's policy, an advisory body shall not represent that
- position before another body, e.g., the state legislature or the county council. An individual member is
- 23 free to voice a position, oral or written, on any issue as long as it is made clear that the member is not
