16 17 18 19	WHEREAS, the City of Lynnwood Water System Plan Update dated 2018, the Sewer System Plan dated 2012, and the Surface Water Plan dated 2021 define the operations and maintenance and capital needs of the utilities; and
20 21	WHEREAS, the City desires to base utility rates on the actual cost of providing all maintenance and operations services and capital construction costs; and
22 23	WHEREAS, the City desires to maintain equity between the amount of utility services used and the amount paid by its customers; and
24 25	WHEREAS, the City desires to make adjustments to rates in order to make capital improvements to infrastructure to meet increasing regulatory requirements; and
26 27	WHEREAS, the utility rate structure was last adjusted in 2020 and before that in 2017; and
28 29 30 31	WHEREAS, on October 10, 2022, the City Council held a duly noticed hearing on the issue of the City's utility rates and regulations, at which time members of the public had the opportunity to present information and opinions relating to the revised rates and regulations set forth in this Ordinance; and
32 33 34 35 36	WHEREAS, the City has determined that it is necessary to revise the rates and fees charges for utility service to implement the adopted Lynnwood Water System Plan, Sewer System Plan, and Surface Water System Plan, to provide necessary revenues to fund capital projects and ongoing maintenance, operation and repair of the City's water, sewer and surface water systems, and to preserve the solvency of the utility;
37 38	NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LYNNWOOD, WASHINGTON, DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1</u>. Section 13.20.010 of the Lynnwood Municipal Code is hereby amended to read
 as follows:

3 **13.20.010 Charges for domestic water.**

The charges for domestic water service shall be based upon the size of meter installed, number of connections or units being serviced therefrom, and the water delivered through the service meter. The bi-monthly rate for each meter size and the maximum water allowed as part of this minimum charge shall be in effect and assessed for all billings issued on or after January 1st of each year, regardless of when the water is actually used.

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3 Section 2. Section 13.20.080 of the Lynnwood Municipal Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

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5 13.20.080 Special Utility rates.

6 A. Qualifications for Special Rates Based on Snohomish County Real Property Tax Exemption. A

7 residential single-unit, multiple-unit, and mobile special fixed rate of the following percent of the bi-

8 monthly base rate and volume charges shall apply to all services to which water, sewer, and surface

9 water services are available, and meeting all of the following qualifications and categories:

10 1. Depending on the income level status of the customer pursuant to the Snohomish County

11 assessor's office real property taxes exemption process, as follows:

- 12 See subsection (H) of this section, Special Water Rate Chart, for specific rate.
- 13 2. The residential single-unit property or residential multiple-unit or mobile unit to which the
- 14 utility service is extended shall have a valid property tax exemption from Snohomish County,
- 15 pursuant to RCW 84.36.381 through 84.36.385.

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3. Claimants for said reduction shall occupy site or unit as principleprincipal residence and be within the corporate limits of the city of Lynnwood and have a household income level no greater than and as prescribed in RCW 84.36.381.

4. Those customers who meet eligibility criteria as stated herein may apply at any time during the year. Upon verification of eligibility, the customer will qualify for the reduced rate as of the date of the next applicable billing cycle following verification. Reapplication for subsequent years demonstrating that qualifications are still met must be made each year by December 31st for the subsequent year.

9 5. Categories.

10a. Senior/Disabled. Persons of the age of 61 years or older, or who are disabled,11meeting the qualifications specified in subsection (A) of this section and RCW1284.36.381, shall be charged at a special water rate for Income Level Status A, Income13Level Status B, or Income Level Status C. See Rate Tables in subsection (H) of this14section for Water, 14.40.040 for Sewer, and 13.35.070 for Surface Water .

15 b. Residential Multiple-Unit and Mobile Special Rates. For residents that meet the 16 qualifications in subsection (A) of this section, but that do not have a direct account with 17 the city (i.e., tenants of a condominium or owners of a mobile home in a mobile home 18 park), a yearly rebate shall be paid to the resident based on 40, 45 or 50 percent of the 19 base rate for that type of account assuming water usage within the minimum 10 CCF 20 allowance, and depending on the income level status of the customer pursuant to the 21 Snohomish County assessor's office real property taxes exemption process. In order to 22 qualify for the rebate for the current calendar year, the resident must make application 23 to the city by November 1st of that year and demonstrate, in addition to meeting the 24 gualifications in this section, that they have resided at the site or unit for the entire year. 25 Rebate does not apply to Utility Taxes.

B. Qualification for Special Rate Based on Washington State Assistance Programs. A residential
single-unit special fixed rate for Income Level Status A (40%) of the residential single-unit bi-monthly
base rate and volume charges shall apply to all services to which water, sewer, and surface water
services are available, and meeting all of the following qualifications:

17	c. Surface Water: Income Level Status A (40%) pursuant to 13.35.070 Table 2.
18	C. Qualification for Yearly Rebate Based on Washington State Free and Reduced Price Meal
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	Programs for Children. A yearly residential rebate may be available in a maximum amount of up to
20	50% of the residential bi-monthly base rate and volume charges for water, sewer, and surface water
21	services paid during the rebate period, where the applicant meets all of the following criteria:
22	1. The applicant is a resident of the residential property receiving the utility services that are
23	the subject of the rebate request, the property is within the corporate limits of the City of
24	Lynnwood, and the applicant has an award letter from the State of Washington for Free and
25	Reduced Price Meal Programs for a child residing in the household that covers at least a
26	portion of the time period for which the rebate is requested.

2. The applicant for said rebate occupies the property receiving the subject utility services as the applicant's <u>principleprincipal</u> residence as an owner or renter, and the applicant provides proof that he or she has resided at the property for at least 6 months, is responsible for the rent or mortgage payments incurred in connection with the property, and is not receiving any other utility rebate or discount authorized in this section.

3. Those customers who meet the eligibility criteria stated in this section may apply to the City
between September 1st and October 31st for a rebate for the yearly period that goes from
October 1st in the prior year to September 30th of that year. Upon verification of eligibility, the
customer will qualify for the yearly rebate. Reapplication for subsequent years demonstrating
that the criteria are still met must be made each year between September 1st and October 31st

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12 4. Rebate: A yearly rebate shall be paid to a qualified resident based on a maximum of 50 13 percent of the base rate for the type of account that is the subject of the application, assuming 14 water usage within the minimum 10 CCF allowance and prorated for the number of months 15 that the customer resided at the address. In order to qualify for the rebate, the resident must 16 demonstrate, in addition to meeting the criteria stated in this section, that they have resided at 17 the site for the specified number of months. The rebate authorized in this section does not 18 apply to utility taxes. Each year, the total amount of funds available for rebates authorized by 19 this subsection C shall be \$100,000, and the total of amount of rebates given to all eligible 20 applicants in any year shall not exceed that amount. Depending on the number of eligible 21 applicants, the amount of rebate awarded to any specific applicant may therefore be less than 22 50 percent of the base rate paid by that applicant during the rebate period. All rebates 23 awarded will be at the same percentage for the type of account.

D. Qualification for Yearly Rebate Based on Age and Income Level. A yearly residential rebate may be available in a maximum amount of up to 50% of the residential bi-monthly base rate and volume charges for water, sewer, and surface water services paid during the rebate period, where the applicant meets all of the following criteria:

1. The applicant is a resident of the residential property receiving the utility services that are
 the subject of the rebate request, the property is within the corporate limits of the City of
 Lynnwood, and the applicant is at least 61 years of age and has a household income that is
 less than 70% of the Washington State Area Medium Income (AMI).

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2. The applicant for said rebate occupies the property receiving the subject utility services as the applicant's <u>principleprincipal</u> residence as an owner or renter, and the applicant provides proof that he or she has resided at the property for at least 6 months, is responsible for the rent or mortgage payments incurred in connection with the property, and is not receiving any other utility rebate or discount authorized in this section.

3. Those customers who meet the eligibility criteria stated in this section may apply to the City
between July 1st and August 31st for a rebate for the yearly period that goes from June 1st in
the prior year to May 31st of that year. Upon verification of eligibility, the customer will qualify
for the yearly rebate. Reapplication for subsequent years demonstrating that the criteria are
still met must be made each year between June 1st and August 31st.

11 4. Rebate: A yearly rebate shall be paid to the qualified resident based on a maximum of 50 12 percent of the base rate for the type of account that is the subject of the application, assuming 13 water usage within the minimum 10 CCF allowance and prorated for the number of months 14 that the customer resided at the address. In order to gualify for the rebate, the resident must 15 demonstrate, in addition to meeting the criteria stated in this section, that they have resided at 16 the site for the specified number of months. The rebate authorized in this section does not 17 apply to utility taxes. Each year, the total amount of funds available for rebates authorized by 18 this subsection D shall be \$100,000, and the total amount of rebates given to all qualified 19 applicants in any year shall not exceed that amount. Depending on the number of eligible 20 applicants, the total amount of rebate awarded to any specific applicant may therefore be less 21 than 50 percent of the base rate paid by that applicant during the rebate period. All rebates 22 awarded will be at the same percentage for the type of account.

E. Medical Necessity. Persons who require large quantities of water due to medical necessity (i.e.,
kidney dialysis) and who occupy the site as principal residence and are located within the corporate
limits of the city of Lynnwood shall be charged the special water and sewer rates for Income Level
Status C (50 percent) with doctor certification (see subsection H of this section, Table 2 for water, and
14.40.040 Table 2 for sewer.

F. Other Special Rate and Qualifications – Preservation Mobile Home Park. For mobile home parks
 that are preserved pursuant to a development agreement in accordance with Chapter <u>1.37</u> LMC, the
 following residential-mobile per unit base rate and volume charges shall apply:

11. Preservation for five to seven years: 50 percent of the base rate and volume charge in LMC213.20.010 for water and 14.40.035 for sewer.

- 3 2. Preservation for seven years or more: 25 percent of the base rate and volume charge in
 4 LMC <u>13.20.010</u>.
- 5 G. The mayor is authorized to administer the special utility rates and develop procedures as necessary
- 6 for such implementation.

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3 Section 3. Section 13.35.070 of the Lynnwood Municipal Code is hereby amended to read
 4 as follows:

5 13.35.070 Utility charges.

6 The following surface water utility rates and charges are hereby established for all sites in the city

7 as set forth in Tables 1 and 2 of this section. These rates and charges shall be in effect and

8 assessed in all billings beginning January 1st of each year.

9 A. Residential Single/Duplex Unit. One ERU bi-monthly for each single-family residential unit on a

10 site. This uniform rate is based on each single-family residential site being equal to one

11 equivalent residential unit (ERU). Each duplex on a site shall be charged one ERU.

1 B. Undeveloped Sites. Undeveloped sites shall not be charged under this system and structure of

2 rates.

3 C. Other Sites. The charge for all other developed sites shall be based upon the total amount of

- 4 measured impervious surface divided by one ERU, and rounded down to the nearest whole
- 5 number. The actual total bi-monthly service charge shall be computed by multiplying the
- 6 measured ERUs for a site by the bi-monthly rate per ERU. All sites will be charged for at least
- 7 one ERU. Sites will be billed as a single-surface water account when a site contains multiple
- 8 water meters and/or businesses on a site. Owners/managers will be responsible for any
- 9 allocation of the surface water charge among tenants.
- 10 D. Special Surface Water Rate.

6 A. The city shall collect a sewer connection charge from any applicant seeking to connect to the 7 sanitary sewer system.

- 8 B. Upon request for a new or modified sewer service connection from any development, the city

10 nonresidential properties, based on number and type of fixtures, calculate the daily sewer flow

16 characteristics of the development and/or principles of fairness. The flow rate shall then

17 determine the number of ERUs as defined below.

18 C. A residential single unit property shall be assigned one ERU per unit as a sewer connection

- 19 charge. A residential multiple unit property shall be assigned 0.75 ERU per unit. A nonresidential
- 20 property shall have a calculated ERU pursuant to the flow calculation described above, but in no

21 case shall the ERU be less than 0.75 ERU for any connection.

22 D. For purposes of this determination, an ERU for service shall consist of a projected usage of

- 23 125 gallons per day of sewage flow.
- E. The sewer connection charge for each ERU of sewer service shall be <u>\$2,480</u> <u>\$4,000</u>.
- F. The sewer connection charge shall be due and payable prior to issuance of the building permit.
