1 2 3 4 LYNNWOOD 5 6 7 **ORDINANCE NO. 3454** 8 9 AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF 10 LYNNWOOD, WASHINGTON AMENDING LMC 2.92.050 RELATED 11 TO PROCUREMENT OF GOODS AND SERVICES; PROVIDING FOR 12 SEVERABILITY; ESTABLISHING AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND 13 PROVIDING FOR SUMMARY PUBLICATION. 14 15 16 WHEREAS, the City of Lynnwood is a steward of public funds and is responsible to ensure 17 transparency and equity in public purchasing; and 18 19 WHEREAS the Municipal Code for the City of Lynnwood outlines specific competitive 20 process thresholds for procurement of goods and services; 21 22 NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LYNNWOOD, WASHINGTON, DO 23 **ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:** 24 25 Section 1: Purpose. The purpose of this ordinance is to update the Lynnwood Municipal 26 Code language to exclude sales tax from procurement thresholds. 27 28 Section 2: Amendments. Section 2.92.050 is hereby amended to read: 29 2.92.050 Procurements of goods and services. 30 This section applies to contracts or procurements for goods and services, including personal 31 services. Contracts shall be solicited under the following competitive process thresholds, with 32 the price inclusive of freight and shipping but exclusive of taxes: A. For purchases and contracts below \$10,000, with the price inclusive of freight and shipping 33 34 but exclusive of taxes, employees and officials are responsible for selecting goods and 35 services in the open market and ensuring best value for the city. 36 37 B. For purchases and contracts between \$10,000 and \$50,000, informal price quotations 38 shall be secured. Employees must: 39 40 1. Research the good or service, and provide a clear and open description of the needs of the

41 city; 42 43 2. Secure a written price quote from multiple sources; 44 45 3. Identify the best price; 46 47 4. Provide written quotes to the manager; and 48 49 5. Manager reviews the informal price quotations and approves or rejects the purchase. 50 51 Procurement may conduct quotations on behalf of departments and offices when requested. 52 53 C. Purchases and contracts more than \$50,000 must be formally advertised in a public 54 manner. 55 56 1. The manager or the manager's designee shall advertise solicitations for the submittal of 57 bids, qualifications or proposals. The notice shall state the date and time for submissions. The 58 solicitation for submittals shall state the relative importance of price and all other evaluation 59 factors. 60 61 2. All bids submitted shall be reviewed for the responsiveness to the bid requirements and 62 for the responsibility of the firm to perform the work described. When all factors have been 63 evaluated, the award of the contract shall be to the lowest responsible, responsive bidder. 64 65 3. For requests for proposals or qualifications and other solicitation methods where price is 66 not the only determining factor, discussions may be conducted with responsible proposers to 67 determine which proposals should be evaluated in more detail or which proposers should be 68 requested to enter negotiations, or both. Negotiations may be conducted concurrently or 69 sequentially. The city may request clarifications and consider adjustments in the proposals 70 to better understand the proposals and to qualify them for further consideration, though 71 information discussed or obtained from one proposer shall not be disclosed to competing 72 proposers during the discussions and negotiations. 73 74 4. Contract award, if at all, shall be made to a responsible offeror(s) whose bid or proposal is 75 determined to be the most advantageous to the city, taking into consideration price and the 76 other established evaluation factors. 78 79 Section 3. Severability. If any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance should 80 be held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or 81 unconstitutionality shall not affect the validity or constitutionality of any other section, sentence, 82 clause or phrase or word of this ordinance. 83 84 Section 4.
