

CITY OF LYNNWOOD

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING LEADING OR RIDING HORSES ON PARKING STRIPS OR SIDEWALKS WITHIN THE CITY OF LYNNWOOD.

WHEREAS the City Council of the City of Lynnwood finds that leading or riding horses on parking strips and sidewalks is inimical to the public health, safety and welfare, and constitutes a nuisance and hazard.

NOW, THEREFORE THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LYNNWOOD DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: Riding on sidewalks, parking strips, etc.

It shall be unlawful for any person to ride or lead a horse, mare, pony or related animal on any sidewalk or parking or planting strip within the City limits. No person shall ride or lead two or more horses, ponies, mares, or related animals abreast on any city street.

Section 2: Penalty


Violation of this ordinance is a misdemeanor punishable by fine not to exceed \$500.00 or imprisonment in the City Jail not to exceed 90 days or by both fine and imprisonment.

Section 3: This ordinance shall take effect five (5) days after its passage, approval and publication.


