

CITY OF LYNNWOOD

ORDINANCE NO. 882

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF LYNNWOOD, WASHINGTON, CREATING A NEW CHAPTER IN THE LYNNWOOD MUNICIPAL CODE ESTABLISHING A DISABILITY BOARD, WITH JURISDICTION OVER POLICE OFFICERS AND FIREFIGHTERS OF THE CITY OF LYNNWOOD, PURSUANT TO LAWS OF 1969, EX. SESSION, CHAPTER 219, AND AS SAME MAY BE AMENDED FROM TIME TO TIME.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LYNNWOOD DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The City of Lynnwood, having a population of over 20,000 persons, in accordance with Chapter 209 of the Laws of 1969, Ex. Session, as amended by Chapter 219, Laws of 1969, Ex. Session, must establish a Disability Board with jurisdiction over all members of the Law Enforcement Officers and Firefighters Retirement System in the City of Lynnwood.

Section 2. There is hereby created a Disability Board, having the jurisdiction over police officers and firefighters as provided by Chapter 209, Laws of 1969, Ex. Session, as amended by Chapter 219, Laws of 1969, Ex. Session.

The Disability Board shall perform all functions, exercise all powers and make such determinations as specified under the foregoing Laws of the State of Washington, as may be amended from time to time.

Section 3. The Disability Board shall consist of the following members:

- A. Two members of the City Council to be appointed by the Mayor.
- B. One firefighter to be elected by the firefighters employed by the City of Lynnwood.
- C. One law enforcement officer to be elected by the police officers.
- D. One member from the public at large who resides within the City of Lynnwood to be appointed by the other four duly appointed and elected members heretofore designated in this section.

All members appointed or elected pursuant to this section shall serve a two year term with the exception of the police officer member who on the first term only serves a one year term. The members shall not receive compensation for their service but shall be reimbursed for travel expense incidental to that service.

Section 4. The Disability Board shall hold regular meetings at such times and places as it deems advisable.

Section 5. The Disability Board shall elect a chairman who shall serve a one year term.


Section 6. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force five days after its passage, approval and publication.


