

CITY OF LYNNWOOD

ORDINANCE NO. 902

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING HORSES AND HORSERIDING ON ARTERIALS AND ESTABLISHING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Lynnwood finds that the presence of horses on certain arterials causes safety and traffic problems.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LYNNWOOD DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: It shall be unlawful for any person to ride or lead or allow any horse, mare, pony or related animal on any of the following arterial streets in the City of Lynnwood:

1. 196th Street S.W. west of 37th Avenue West
2. Highway 99
3. 44th Avenue West south of 192nd St. S.W.
4. 200th Street S.W.

Provided that it shall not be unlawful for any person to dismount and lead by rein or rope any horse, mare, pony or related animal directly across any of the above streets or arterials.

Section 2: Any person who violates any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and punishable by a fine or bail forfeiture in an amount not to exceed \$25.00.

Section 3: This ordinance shall take effect and be in force five (5) days after its passage, approval and publication.
