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5 **A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF LYNNWOOD, WASHINGTON, TO BUILD A**
6 **COMMUNITY RECOVERY CENTER ON THE SITE OF THE COMMUNITY JUSTICE**
7 **CENTER, AS A SEPARATE ENTITY, WHICH WILL SERVE THE GROWING**
8 **BEHAVIORAL HEALTH NEEDS OF LYNNWOOD AND THE SOUTH SNOHOMISH**
9 **COUNTY COMMUNITY.**

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14 *WHEREAS, the City of Lynnwood and its elected officials have a duty to serve all members*
15 *of the community, protecting their basic human rights, and ensuring their safety and well-being;*
16 *and*

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18 *WHEREAS, Lynnwood's Community Vision states that Lynnwood strives, "To be a cohesive*
19 *community that respects all citizens," and "To be a city that is responsive to the wants and needs*
20 *of our citizens;" and*

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22 *WHEREAS, the COVID pandemic has exacerbated behavioral health needs by increasing*
23 *symptoms amongst individuals with a pre-existing mental health or substance use challenge and*
24 *prompting the onset of clinically significant behavioral health symptoms and suicidality in*
25 *individuals with no previous behavioral health history; and*

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27 *WHEREAS, in Snohomish County there were 232 overdose deaths last year, a tragic record*
28 *for the region; and*

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30 *WHEREAS, according to the Washington State Department of Health, fatal overdose*
31 *increases were most pronounced among people of color; and*

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33 *WHEREAS, the Lynnwood City Council voted on August 2, 2021, to delay the construction*
34 *contract award for the building of the Community Justice Center to provide time for a task force*
35 *to research the possibility of adding community behavioral health services to the project; and*

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37 *WHEREAS, the task force is proposing a reduction in the number of jail beds from 120 to*
38 *84, a 31% reduction, in order to accommodate new treatment and re-entry services for individuals*
39 *in custody as well as a community recovery center that will serve community members*
40 *experiencing crises related to mental health, substance use disorder and suicidality; and*

41 WHEREAS, through redesign efforts, the building will be able to leverage new Medicaid
42 access laws in order to enhance behavioral and medical health services for individuals in custody
43 and reduce in custody jail medical costs; and

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45 WHEREAS, the proposed community recovery center would be the first and only behavioral
46 health urgent care and crisis stabilization facility in South Snohomish County; and

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48 WHEREAS, the City of Lynnwood has received letters of support from Snohomish County
49 government and the 32nd District legislative delegation to help fund the Community Recovery
50 Center, thus relieving the taxpayers of Lynnwood from bearing the costs of construction and
51 development; and

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53 WHEREAS, with the incorporation of improved in-custody services and community
54 behavioral health services, the Community Justice Center and Community Recovery Center will be
55 a regional and national model for integrated criminal legal and behavioral health services; and

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57 WHEREAS, in recognition that the needs of our community are constantly changing, the
58 services provided by the Community Justice Center and the Community Recovery Center should
59 remain nimble and flexible; and

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61 THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LYNNWOOD, WASHINGTON, DO RESOLVE AS
62 FOLLOWS:

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64 Sections 1. *The City Council approves the implementation of the Community Recovery*
65 *Center design process as a separate facility on the site of the Community Justice Center, as*
66 *presented by the Lynnwood Community Recovery Center Task Force on September 7th, 2021. City*
67 *Council directs staff to continue working with the Washington State Legislature, Snohomish*
68 *County government and community partners to bring forward detailed Community Recovery*
69 *Center design documents for Council action.*
